SCHOOL PICNIC/'MEET THE TEACHER"

Get it in your calendar **Thursday 22nd February - School Picnic/Meet the Teacher.** The school grounds will be host to a school picnic that starts 5.30pm onwards where you can bring a blanket and some kai to have with your family. BEING SAFE AT 3PM

At 3pm when the bell goes can we please ask our community to do some important actions to ensure the safety of our tamariki and other footpath and road users.

- 1. Use the Kea Crossing when it is operational between 3pm and 3.10pm if needing to cross the road. Our tamariki are impressionable and so if you cross over on the Tūpare bend or at other places on the busy Mangorei Road it is sending messages to them about taking these chances themselves
- 2. Do not park on the yellow lines/or double park in the school driveway/ or the neighbours driveways or attempt to squeeze past cones in the bus bay. Please be considerate of the visibility that our patrollers need to see up and down Mangorei Road.

KEA CROSSING ROAD PATROL

At Mangorei School our Year 7 students have the very important job of operating our Kea Crossing after school. This is the first opportunity for our Year 7 students to start collecting CV points and working their way earning the special Year 7 and 8 certificates awarded in these years. A permission slip will be sent home with interested Year 7's this week to be signed and returned to school by Monday 12th February. We are still trying to finalise a time slot for training our new Road Patrollers, we will let you know as soon as we do when this will be occurring. A big thanks to our Year 8's who will be filling in with this duty until our new Patrollers are trained.

YEAR 7/8 IMMUNISATIONS

On Thursday 15th of February, we have our Public Health team coming in to talk with our Year 7 and 8 students around immunisations offered at school. The nurses talk through what a vaccination is and the students watch a video clip on the immunisation for their year group. Parents and Caregivers are more than welcome to attend this session if they would like to. Following these sessions information booklets will come home with your child for you to read and either consent or not consent to the immunisation being given. Please return these to school promptly. No immunisations can be given without the signed consent form being returned to school. You can opt to take your child to your GP for these immunisations if you prefer. The immunisations are scheduled for Thursday 7th of March.

AMBASSADOR TRYOUTS/HOUSE CAPTAIN ELECTIONS

On Thursday 15th February those Year 8 students who would like to be considered for our Ambassador roles will have the opportunity to present a short prepared speech to our Year 5-8 students. This speech should outline why they are wanting to be considered for this role and what they can offer to the position. Following the speeches our students will vote for the people they believe will fill the role best. The students will also present their speech to our Senior Leadership team, who will consider student votes and decide on our Term 1 and 2 Ambassadors. Every Year 8 student who tries out receives a CV point.

House Captains will be elected by student vote and this process will take place once Ambassadors have been chosen.
