- 20 vacancies in the Year 0 to Year 3
- 5 vacancies in the Year 4 to Year 8

areas of our school for the remainder of 2024 for out of zone students, starting at the beginning of Term 2 through to the end of Term 4 2024.

Application forms are available by emailing office@mangorei.school.nz The deadline for receipt of applications is **27th March 2024 by 4:00pm**.

If the number of applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. Ballots, if required, will be held by Monday 1st April. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

WHĀNAU KAI TAHI DAY

On Friday 8th March, to coincide with Tri/Bi, we are having our first Whānau Kai Tahi day for the year! This is a time where whanau can go into the classroom with their child to have a look at what is happening in the class, see the environment, be taken through what they have been doing in the first half of the term. After Whānau Kai Day (which follows on from Tri/Bi, we understand that this is on the Friday before a long weekend) some caregivers may wish to take their child earlier. There will be a sign out sheet in the classroom that you must sign before taking your child home. The school day finishes at the normal time.

Key Information

- The season goes from Mid-May to September.
- Year 0-2 and Year 3-4 teams play Miniball, mostly between 3.30 pm and 5.45pm on a Wednesday, but with the odd game on a Monday for Year 0-2 or Tuesday for Year 3-4 afterschool.
- Year 5/6 (teams play between 4pm and 6.40pm on a Monday.
- Year 7/8 boys teams play Monday evenings.
- Year 7/8 girls teams play on Tuesday afternoons.
- Students will be issued with a Mangorei uniform to play in.
- Practice times will be advised once coaches are aligned with teams.
- As with last year, mouthguards are compulsory for all levels (one is provided at start of season by the NPBA).

Completing the entry is a commitment to play a team sport. Teams are organised based on these numbers (along with the subs) and withdrawal can greatly affect others in the team. If you have more than one child playing please complete separate forms for each. Can't wait to see our kids on the court!
