KIDS LIT QUIZ

On Wednesday 10th April we will be having three teams of Year 7/8 students competing at The Kids' Lit Quiz. The quiz encourages students to read widely for pleasure across genres and authors whether that be books, or electronic devices and it improves their performance across curriculum areas. Just a reminder that reading for pleasure includes: fiction, non-fiction, graphic novels, magazines, websites and even cereal packets! The teams will work collaboratively during the quiz to answer 100 questions in ten categories. The categories are diverse in order to cater for all reading tastes. Book prizes are awarded and there are prizes for the winning team. The event lasts for three hours, with a twenty-minute break at the halfway point.

Students had to trial to be a part of this team by answering 30 questions provided by the quiz master and from the results 12 students have been chosen. If your child is in the team you will be contacted soon with more details.
