PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Tēnā Koutou Whānau o Mangorei!

It has been a pleasure to meet some new families at Mangorei over the last week and hear the lovely success of their tamariki settling into the routine of school. One of the strengths of the Mangorei Staff is to work at helping tamariki to settle into the new environment. We understand that all our children have different levels of adaptability and so are here to support them from whereever they are at. We encourage families to work with the school if there is anything better we can do to help with the transition.

Today we want to share with you an important date. It is not until Term 3 but we would love for you to grab your calendar - virtual, printable or writeable - and jot it down. That date is **Friday 26th July.** Why? This will be the day we hold our Three-way Learning Conferences (Student/Teacher/Parent). On that day there will be 15 minute slots that you will be able to book and we would ask you to keep your child at home that day, bringing them in when the interview time is. This is a change from last year as we are responding to feedback from families with 2 or more children when these were done over multiple days, and the challenge of having to come in multiple times over the week. Our staff also fed back around interview week being very taxing - doing full day interviews, then having to teach the rest of the week, with extra students in the class while other teachers had their interviews. I hope the way this is organised this year will support both our larger whanau and staff. We will give reminders over the term, as well as let families know when appointment bookings become live through HERO.

On the topic of HERO I did talk with a parent the other day about their child's progress and it became apparent that they had not been seeing the real-life reporting posts that the teachers had been posting on their child's Learning and Progress tab in HERO. There was a bit of a surprise when they saw they had many learning posts sitting there from this and last year! If you need help with getting the HERO app or accessing your child's learning posts then please check in with your child's teacher via email. These posts can make for great conversations at home. Just to reiterate that you don't need a 'post' or an interview time to come in to see your child's teacher email is the best contact initially but you certainly are encouraged to make a time to come in if you have any questions around your child's learning.

On the topic of important dates, this term has quite a few - King's Birthday and Matariki are days the school is closed. Another 'school's closed' day is a Teacher Only Day we are having to look at the Curriculum Refresh which is a big piece of work we are facing as educators. A day which we are looking forward to is our **Puanga Celebration Day** which will have a community invite to as well for part of the day. You can find all these important dates in the calendar part of this newsletter, and also on the calendar tab in HERO.

As part of our special ANZAC assembly last week some of our tamariki noticed we have new, larger crosses added to our ANZAC display. Last year Tom decided to research the specific 'old boys' of Mangorei School who are named on the Memorial Board up in the Upper Mangorei Road Cricket Club. Yesterday members of our Enviro Group, that had been involved in the propagation and planting of kūmara tipu at the end of last year, continued their mahi to haul in a handsome harvest! 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2024 KIWI ENGLISH, MATHEMATICS & SCIENCE COMPETITIONS

Mangorei School is offering your child the opportunity to participate in the KIWI English, Mathematics and Science competitions. These competitions take place annually and are designed by New Zealand teachers for New Zealand students based on the New Zealand Curriculum. For further information, please consult the CAM website <u>www.canterbury.ac.nz/cam</u>

These are replacing the ICAS exams that have traditionally been done at school.

The competitions are open to all Year 5-8 students in English, Mathematics and Science. Students can enter in one or more subjects. Each competition will provide parents/caregivers with an individual student report of their child's overall performance. These are available through your school. The supervised online tests will take place in the last 3 weeks of Term 2 and the first week of Term 3. The competitions are to be administered at school under exam conditions and supervised. All participating students will receive a certificate and a prize will be awarded to the top student nationally in each competition. If two or more students share the same top score then the prize is awarded to the student with the highest speed and accuracy.

NOTE: Their policy is not to release test papers. The tests are provided primarily as a competition and not as a teaching resource. Entries are administered by the school. For further information, please consult the CAM website www.canterbury.ac.nz/cam

Each exam costs \$9.90 per student and will be added to your child's account once you have registered.

SCOOTER AND CYCLE SKILLS

We have Scooter and Bike Skill sessions coming up which will be held here at school by Let's Go Mā ake.

The aim of the Scooter Skills programme is to:

- Build scooter rider skill and confidence through fun exercises
- Reinforce scooter rider safety and courtesy while riding on the footpath

With the Cycle Skills, two grades of training may be delivered, with trainees being assessed following the completion of each grade. Grade 1 is taught in a non-traffic environment to enable skills to be developed. Grade 2 builds on the skills of Grade 1 and is taught on lightly trafficked, single-lane roads. All trainees' skills will be assessed prior to training on the road, and full risk management procedures are followed to ensure the safety of all trainees.

Next week consent forms will be coming home with students for these sessions. A form will be required to be completed for each child please.
