# **PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE**

Kia Ora Mangorei Whānau,

There are certain things that make me angry and reading the headline 'NZ has the highest rate of School Bullying in the OECD' is one of those. 15% of students reported being bullied frequently. I think everyone who works in the area of education in NZ suddenly felt like a flat balloon when that came out a few weeks ago. Last year the adult results were just as deflating - over 90 % of the workforce in NZ has reported experiencing intermittent bullying in their workplaces over the past year in a Massey University study. Is this a case of our tamariki reflecting the actions of adult behaviour they see in the media, home or even those in our country's leadership? Or are schools preparing students to become tomorrow's 'bullies' in the workplace? I certainly don't have the writing space to get into such a complex nationwide issue and even now, this is a tough topic to raise with our community who I know sit strongly with us in terms of our school's values of respect, accountability, trustworthiness, and empathy. However, not talking about it doesn't make it any less a community/nationwide issue.

What we can talk about is bullying exists in all schools. We cannot control every school, however we are able to direct our own school's response. Our definition of bullying is that it is deliberate, involves a power imbalance, causes harm and is repeated. We have 5 to 13 year olds at school and tit isin these years of life where kids are learning what it means to be a good citizen. We know they (like adults too) learn by making mistakes. Teachers spend much of their day helping children learn from their mistakes. Mistakes towards each other can come down to making a poor choice, or letting emotion guide actions without the thinking process needed to see consequences. It is when the poor choice towards someone is repeated that we begin to look at bullying becoming the description for these actions. We hope that the relationship between school and home is always seen as a partnership . Parents are always able to communicate with school if they are concerned about their child experiencing this.

This week, this has been the talk as we gear up to the School Council running 'Pink Shirt/Wacky Hair Day' on Friday. In our Te Tae o Rehua Roopu Assembly we talked about being an upstander and the danger of thinking that helping someone experiencing bullying is being a 'Snitch' - when it is actually a heroic and brave thing to do.

I'll finish with a quote from Seatoun Principal John Western who said "Schools work so hard to create cultures, but we reflect communities, and we reflect the wider culture of the day so it is a wider responsibility as well."

Let's all keep on with doing this good work together.
