PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Kia Ora Koutou Mangorei Whānau,

It was an early morning start today to see off our Year 8 students as they headed to National Young Leaders Day in Hamilton. Today they got to hear from: a former NZ Hockey Rep, an explorer who lost his leg in a volcanic eruption, an entrepreneur who started their business at age 18, a 16 year old conservation and climate advocate talking on how small actions lead to bigger opportunities, a jazz/pop NZ musician and a digital artist! No doubt some great stories to be heard and inspiring words for our seniors to take on board. Huge thanks to *Mrs Saywell* for her organisation, and to *Mr Henson* and *Jari Jacobs* who accompanied the group together with our parent helpers.

Yesterday some of our staff were at an event where we got to see close to 30 Ex-Mangorei Students, all in the age range of 18 to 21 years old. Some even came to school earlier in the day to say hi and go for a walk around the school grounds - a bit of a reminiscing time to see the changes to our grounds and buildings over the years.

One thing that struck all the staff at this event was the lovely support and closeness all these lovely young people still have. Their simple shared experience of primary school and a commitment to keep in touch (this is where social media connectivity is at it's best) saw these bonds still so strong.

I often get worried about the disruption the covid years has had on our social relationships. Be our whānau either country or city, will our current tamariki grow into 20-somethings with such an accepting and great group of friends to draw on and feel support from? If it's to be, then I feel that there are some things that we can do as family and school to support that.

- 1. At school continue our focus on building a strong class and school culture. Being able to celebrate both the similarities and differences between us all, encouraging an acceptance of others and providing opportunities (in and out of learning situations) for friendships to form.
- 2. Encourage your tamariki into joining in with sport or hobby situations where friendships grow easier with common likes and interests.
- 3. Create your own shared experiences. Invite another Mangorei family around for tea one night (we used to do breakfasts!) build your own connections while the kids build theirs.
- 4. Work together with us. If you feel like your child is struggling to make friends then be in touch with the teacher/myself. Teachers can offer a perspective on whose personalities can connect more readily with another personality and in some cases we can help manufacture situations for these connections to happen at school, which you can then strengthen outside of school.

Apologies, I have a tendency to get a bit preachy with my comments. Note these are just my thoughts which were prompted by what I saw yesterday. It was so uplifting to see these young people and the genuine care and love they showed for each other - and I want that for all our kids when they get older too.

PUANGA DAY - 21st JUNE

Our national matariki celebration will be 28th June. However in taranaki it is puanga (rigel) that we look for in the skies to help welcome in the the coming year. Therefore, our school will be celebrating puanga the week before matariki by having a whole school puanga day.

This will involve all our students completing different activities throughout the day. To begin the day they will spend time with their classroom learning about puanga. After morning tea our tuakana/teina classes will work together to create whētu (stars) that will be displayed in the hall. The afternoon will be spent in our syndicates completing different traditional activities (weaving, games, art, waiata and so on).

Leading up to our puanga day our school whariki will go on tour around all the classes, for our akonga to take a closer look at and look after.

As part of this day we will also be holding a special puanga assembly at 12pm. We felt that this celebration was the perfect time of the term to have our whānau kai tahi. Whānau are welcome to come and enjoy our assembly as well then spend time with your tamariki for lunch. Children will be expected to stay at school after whānau kai tahi, and take part in their syndicate activities in the afternoon.
