#### **PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE**

Mānawatia a Matariki! Let's acknowledge Matariki!

It was a clear, brisk and beautiful morning today where we celebrated the work of so many people in getting the finished footpath to fruition at the end of last year. We welcomed and thanked *Matt Richardson* and *Terry Wheeler* from the NPDC, *Sarah Wilson* and *Nathaniel Benefield* from the Let's Go team, *Chris Miller* (the designer) from Red Jacket, *Sarah Giles* and *Shawn Scott* from NZTA and representatives from Graham Harris and Downers.

We did a walking train that left the 'station' at different times this morning taking interested kids and caregivers for a walk down to Branch Road and back. It is so hard to believe we survived for close to 20 years with a 'temporary' footpath that was just over a metre wide! Kids were treated to milo and hot pancakes and it provided a chance for us to acknowledge the above people for all their contributions to getting this for the school (and the community we are in). Foot traffic has increased by 35%!

The best way to celebrate it is to **use it** and we really do want to promote walking, biking or scootering to school. Remember we have raincoats and jackets to manage the not so good days (which rarely happen in Taranaki of course). Exercise promotes good blood flow and endorphins, which in turn sets kids up well for a day of learning.

I really want to thank the Teachers for what has been an outstanding term. It has been lovely to hear the conversations around celebrating the learning kids are doing. We celebrate progress and teachers are looking to make their Overall Teacher Judgements on where each child sits in terms of curriculum expectations. They have been busy preparing posts to share on your child's Learning and Progress Tab on HERO, as well as getting ready to show on the 2024 Report Tab; your child's progress (a graphic of a dial will show this), overall teacher judgements and curriculum goals set by the teacher for Reading, Writing, Maths and in the area of Key Competencies. Be ready for this action on Thursday next week!

Please note that on next Thursday we will also be opening up for appointments which are also done on the HERO app ready for our Mid-Year learning hui on the first Friday back!

I hope you not only find time to catch your breath with this long weekend but also get to grab onto the spirit of what Matariki and Puanga is all about. Create new traditions for your whānau, have a load of fun and try and get out for a spot of stargazing!

We are excited to share that **Mangorei School has been selected to participate in a Transport Pilot** organised by the Ministry of Education in partnership with SportNZ and DecarbonEd.

The programme will empower our students with the tools they need to envision and create a low-carbon future. Transport is the beginning of this journey. We will utilise our unique carbon footprint and data collected through the pilot to understand how our staff and students travel to and from school and to consider what transport options we want for the future of our community.

Along with our carbon footprint, the pilot programme will provide data tools to model potential changes, curriculum resources, and a Carbon Neutral School Lead. Congratulations to *Mrs Angela Duncan* for taking on this new role. She will act as the conduit between Mangorei School and the pilot, ensuring that we are able to get the most from this valuable opportunity.
