#### **PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE**

Tena Koutou Mangorei Whānau,

A month of winter already done and we have passed the shortest day already - it'll be summer before we know so let's appreciate the refreshing feel of winter while we have it! This has been a real term of community connection for us and we have really appreciated caregivers making the most of any opportunities to come into school and support the 'city school, country heart' feel we have come to love.

This week is a big one for teachers as they have been assessing and working with your tamariki to get an accurate gauge on their progress since the start of the year. Teachers have been looking at what goals they have achieved and what these achievements look like compared to our curriculum expectations. You may have read some posts on your child's learning already this term on Literacy and Numeracy as Teachers let you in to see what they are blessed to be part of everyday. Please see later in the newsletter some information around how to access their Learning and Progress and their Mid-Year 2024 Report showing their teacher's Overall Teacher Judgement. Tomorrow is the day where all this comes live on HERO so please make some time in your evening to have a look through the Learning and Progress and Report 2024 tabs on your child's profile. It will also include some bullet-points from the teacher on what they would like to bring up with you at the hui. You can then comment on these and add in your points that you would like to raise in this hui. This is helpful for teachers as they can prepare for your points to make effective use of the time.

Also tomorrow (Thursday), 15-minute appointment booking times come live on HERO A reminder we are doing these on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> July across the day, starting at 8.30am and finishing at 5.30pm. This means that you will come to school at your appointment time with your child and then leave with them once done. Thank you for your patience with this while we trial this approach to accommodate our families with more than one child, and also to support the wellbeing of the teaching staff.

If you do need care for your child on the day, *Carl Robb* and the Kelly Sports team will be running a day programme from the school hall. There is a cost involved and you will need to book in - there will be information later in the newsletter on this including a link. If this is the case you can pop in and collect them from the hall to go to your learning hui, then drop them back there afterwards.

As we reach the end of the term I want to wish everyone a magic winter break. We love the caregiver support we have from our community and look forward to reconnecting again in the new term. Keep safe and warm!

#### MANGOREI SCHOOL MID-YEAR LEARNING HUI (A MUST READ!)

You will be able to book in for a time to meet with your child's teacher through the Hero app when it comes live **tomorrow afternoon**. Click on the <u>school booking</u> icon, select your <u>child's teacher</u> and then select a <u>time</u> that suits you.
