NPBHS/NPGHS OPEN EVENINGS

NPBHS

The purpose of the Open Evening at NPBHS is to warmly welcome you to the school community, and provide you with valuable information about the school, and guide you through the enrolment and course option selection processes for the year ahead.

Guided tours of the school are from 3:30pm (session 1) and 4:30pm (session 2) followed by the headmasters address. These will be held in the Ryder Hall on Coronation Avenue.

NPGHS

The students of New Plymouth Girls' High School invite students and whānau to come along to our Open Day. They would love to show you around and give you a taste of what our school and hostel have to offer. NPGHS is about opportunities and there is something for everyone.

Our hostel will be open for anyone interested in learning about boarding opportunities at our Kura. You are welcome to visit the hostel at any time between 1.00 – 3.00pm.

We invite you to join us on a tour of the school where you will be able to speak to students and staff and hear their experiences of NPGHS.

Tours will commence at 3.30pm from the hall, followed by a presentation at 4.45pm on our school and the opportunities that we have to offer. After the presentation tours of the school will recommence at 5.30pm.

ALL CLASSROOMS HEAD TO TOPEC!

We have been fostering a connection over the past year with our neighbours at TOPEC and are excited about our next project with them. All classes will be visiting TOPEC, an outdoor education centre on Hydro Road, for a day trip during Term 3. The dates for each class are on the newsletter calendar, you will see they are spread out over the term, with one class going at a time each Tuesday and Thursday.

The visit is a chance for our kura to engage in the 'Knowing our Place – E mōhio pū ki tāku turanga' part of our School Vision by getting to know more about our area and what makes it special. The day will include a hikoi, learning about the whenua, bush, pests, and an introduction to maramataka (traditional Māori lunar calendar that can be used to guide planting, harvesting, fishing and hunting). It will also be a great connection to the Active Transport: Carbon Emissions unit that many classes are learning about.

We would love it if some parents could join their child's class for this trip. Please keep an eye out on Hero for a teacher's message about this when your child's visit is getting close.

Classes will leave school at 9:15am in a TOPEC van and/or parent transport and will return at about 1:45pm. The trips will still go ahead if wet, so please be prepared for this.

TOPEC has requirements for Health and Safety. There will be an online risk disclosure form that will need to be completed for each child before they go on the trip. Your child's classroom teacher will send this to you shortly.

The gear needed for the trip is:

- Gumboots or shoes that are okay to get mucky and wet
- Raincoat
- Wet weather pants if you have them
- Warm clothes like fleece, thermals, beanie, gloves, warm socks
- Change of clothes and shoes to be left at school
- Bag for taking home wet gear
- Water bottle
- Big morning tea (children will eat a late lunch back at school)
- Car seat for tamariki...

A cost of approximately \$5 will be added to your account to pay for this trip.
