#### **PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE**

Tēnā Koutou Mangorei Whānau,

....and a huge thank you for Friday. It was wonderful to see our community coming in to talk learning with their child and teacher. I enjoyed talking to some families around the school and hearing positive feedback around the set up for these interviews - we welcome feedback on this. We had close to 90% of all families attend and I know those who were unable to go due to sickness or being away have booked in over the week. As you know we have trialled different approaches over the years and are hopefully getting the right format for this important hui. It is also so fitting to thank the teachers for their ongoing work that lead up to the learning hui, the assessments and planning, and the preparation building up to these. We hope you felt more informed about where your child is at, what they have achieved and what their next steps are. Also a reminder you don't need a specified learning hui day to come and talk about your child's learning - at anytime you are welcome to make contact with your child's teacher for a discussion.

One part of our school vision is 'Knowing our place' 'E mōhio pū ki tāku turanga' and one of our strategic actions in striving towards this is to investigate and action ways to have wider school participation with TOPEC. We are the closest kura to TOPEC and the area itself is not far off a 15 minute walk from school (if a safe footpath existed!). The area was widely known in pre-european Māori times as a safe place where different hapū (subtribes) could meet, including Ngāti Tūparikino who are the people of this area. It was known for its river and fertile soil that was rich in nutrients and therefore was a fantastic mara (garden) for these hapū to come and grow their crops. Our envirogroup have used this place to grow kumara last year. This was a wonderful science based learning opportunity, including Mātauranga Māori (Māori knowledge on the how the maramataka - Māori Calendar- was used to grow good veges) for this group.

Now to make steps for all our students to learn more about 'our place' we are going to need to actually take them all there! A huge thanks to *Mrs Penelope Moffat* who has organised these for the school with every class heading to TOPEC over this term. Please be alert to information coming out around your particular child's trip in the term. If you click on the calendar icon on <u>HERO</u> you will be able to see when your child is going. Teachers will be asking for parent help so this is a great opportunity for you to gain some understanding of this special place.

As an aside I would like to thank parent *Mrs Andrea Mathews* who worked with *Mrs Morgan Brewer* in Toroa to develop our first ever Mangorei School public facebook page over the last few months. The purpose of this page is to provide another medium to share our celebrations and allow anyone to be able to read and get a feel for what Mangorei School is all about, our 'vibe' and what we experience by being a school in this community.
