#### **PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE**

Kia Ora Koutou Mangorei Whānau,

Arohamai - It's a bit of a big newsletter this week but there is just lots on! Grab a cuppa, pop your feet up and have a read!

As you will be aware attendance in schools has been a big focus of this current government, continuing the work of the previous one, as schools built back from the Covid-19 pandemic. We are grateful to have strong support from our community in getting tamariki to school, and the high esteem education is held in, with our families. It certainly can be tough on families when tamariki are sick, or experiencing longer periods of illness that sees them not able to be here at school. These absences are very much justified. We know that our families are always problem solving around how to bolster their children's immune systems in these cases.

Holidays away with the family are certainly enriching and brilliant memory making experiences and at families discretion. As a school we would ask that if possible they are taken in the school holiday breaks.

The graphic below is an interesting one. If tamariki are consistently having days off then it provides an insight into how much school is missed by the time they have 8 years of schooling (end of Year 8).

Missing a day a week means that by the time they reach Year 8 they have Missed one and a half years of schooling. A year and a half! Imagine missing a year and a halfs worth of learning! This would make the step to High School more of a challenge.

As a school we want to work with families if you are experiencing any challenges with attendance. In the past we have been able to link in with our Public Health Nurse who can support if health absences are ongoing (not taking the place of a local GP visit of course) but they can advise on matters that could help you at home.

On another matter we are excited about Friday where our Kapa Haka Roopu will be on stage at the Tatarakihi Competition that is held at



Owae Marae in Waitara at 12.45. It is a real privilege for all Year 4-8 tamariki to be able to choose to be part of this roopu and commit to the weekly practices. Toitoiwhakamanawa is the name of our group which relates to the energetic movements of the fantail and the path it takes in the air. A huge thanks goes to *Miss Aaliyah Reade* who has been coordinating the Kapa Haka group this year and the tutors who do an exceptional job - *Whaea Unity Wara* and *Matua Kaarena Kingi* - Ka rawe kōrua! #### \*\*\* IMPORTANT SH3 LANE CLOSURES\*\*\*

As mentioned in previous newsletters, there will be road closures on SH3 between Burgess Park (between Mangorei and Kent Roads. This will be in place for the next 8 weeks from **Monday 16<sup>th</sup> September 2024**.

During this time, SH3 between Mangorei & Kent Roads will be under a 24/7 single lane closure southbound traffic from midnight to midday, and northbound traffic from midday to midnight every day for the duration of works.

## \*\*\*IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR OUR BUS STUDENTS DURING THE ROAD CLOSURES\*\*\*

Our students who travel to and from school on the bus will go via the normal route into Mangorei School in the morning. We would suggest the departure time from the Hall in the morning, be brought forward by 10 minutes during these works to ensure we meet the transfer with Withers at your school on time. The morning departure time during these works will be 7:50am. The afternoon bus will collect the students from Mangorei School as normal, travel out to Mangorei Hall as normal, the traffic will determine if we arrive at the hall slightly later or not.

#### **SPCA CUPCAKE DAY**

Some wonderful students from around the school have set up an SPCA fundraising group and will hold a Mangorei School SPCA Cupcake Day on **Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> September.** Cupcakes will be sold at the hall and all proceeds will be donated to the SPCA. Posters designed by some of the SPCA team will be put up around the school and in classes, and reminders will be put in the school memo leading up to the day.

Anyone can make cupcakes to donate and help raise money, often these have been decorated in an SPCA theme, but any delightful and delicious cupcakes are welcome! Cupcake donations can be delivered to the hall kitchen on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> September before school.

Cupcakes will be sold from the hall throughout morning tea, and at lunchtime if there are still some to sell. Usually they are sold for around **\$2 or \$3** each, depending on the size and decorations.

We are also collecting donations of food, newspapers, old blankets and towels. These can be also put in the boxes on the stage in the hall on Wednesday  $18^{th}$  September, or brought to Kōtare anytime before then.

## **'THE CHEMISTRY OF CAKE' - BAKING CHALLENGE WITH MRS ROSS**

A small group from Ahuwhenua explored 'The Chemistry of Cake', using the 'Make Vegetable Cake' School Kit. The concept is inspired by Eugenia Cheng's Chocolate Conference Cake, which features in her book 'How to Bake Pi: An Edible Exploration of the Mathematics of Mathematics'. Basically, as long as you have equal amounts of ingredients (for our baking we used fat, sugar, egg, and flour), it doesn't matter what order you choose to add them in, you still get cake. A tasty way to learn about Associative Maths too!

As part of the learning process, we looked at chemical changes, and how they differ from physical changes. We tested chemical change by making 'Fizzy Hands' using gloves, dishwashing liquid, vinegar, and baking soda... which did get quite messy!

The challenge was understanding about added sugar, and how to reduce the added sugar in our cupcakes to make them more nutritional, by using different substitutes. We also had to consider 'Bubble Theory' - how to get air into the cupcakes to make them light with good texture and structure. For this we were using self raising flour, as we weren't using the traditional creaming method of the fat and sugar to create air. The first bake involved 'Theory Cakes', which gave some interesting results. We discovered it was important not to swap out the dry ingredient (flour) with wet ingredients. This made the cupcakes more stodgy, oily and flat, and reduced a lot of the air we needed as it also reduced the baking powder ratio from the self raising flour. Also, not everyone liked the taste of pureed beetroot or corn in their baking, so choosing the right flavoured substitute was also important! The recipes were then reviewed and a second round of baking was done to see how the taste, look, texture, and structure of the cupcakes could be improved. These were quite successful, and also achieved our goal of reducing added sugar.
