Let's keep the momentum building this week as we celebrate the reo in Māori Language week! Thank you to **Miss Aaliyah Reade** who is challenging us at school this week with some great opportunities to korero Māori!

I really want to start by encouraging you to get along and hear speaker *Kathryn Berkett* tonight. When she speaks tonight she is coming from a psychology-research base that can be so beneficial in how we parent our children.
