I am forever proud of the fact we have a language special to our country and that the rate and growth of the Māori Language continues to grow and build real momentum across the land. I was just the proudest person in the marquee when our Kapa Haka Roopu Toitoiwhakamanawa performed - kids just loving the reo, the movement, the being-in-unison and the experience of representing the kura - at Tatarakihi.

Let's keep the momentum building this week as we celebrate the reo in Māori Language week! Thank you to **Miss Aaliyah Reade** who is challenging us at school this week with some great opportunities to kōrero Māori!

I really want to start by encouraging you to get along and hear speaker **Kathryn Berkett** tonight. I have personally heard Kathryn speak from experience and can say she is not only an expert in her field but also has the ability to put complex ideas into a very easy to understand way. When she speaks tonight she is coming from a psychology-research base that can be so beneficial in how we parent our children. Resilience is one of the top qualities we want in our young people and so to hear her speak on this topic will be of interest to all of us that want to be the best parents we can be. 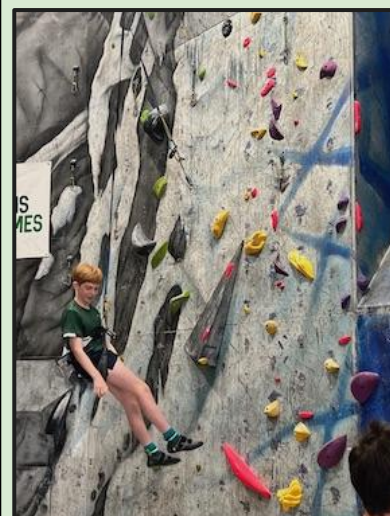


## AIMS GAMES - ROCK CLIMBING BY BRODIE STEWART
