YEAR 6 WATER SAFETY SESSIONS

This week the Year 6's from Kererū and Kōtare are enjoying water safety lessons at the Todd Energy Aquatic Centre. On our first day we learned some survival strokes to self-rescue if we were lost overboard or in any other emergency situation at sea. We also learned how to enter the water safely with a jump from a height - using one of 3 different drops, a pin (arms to the sides), a "coffin" (crossed arms to protect the organs and a variation of the coffin called "hold the nose, protect the organs". Over the next two days we will do life jacket work and also practice dropping over the side of an inflatable. Here are a couple of photos from the classes.
