# PETS DAY - NEXT FRIDAY 25TH OCTOBER!!!

Here are answers to some common questions about our upcoming Pets Day.

## Q: Who can come to Pets Day?

A: It's open to anyone ... We love seeing members of the wider community attending.

## Q: Does Pets Day go on regardless of the weather?

*A:* Yes it does. We keep as close to the original programme as possible but will modify it accordingly if it is wet. Come prepared in case of wet weather.

## Q: Do we still bring animals if it is really wet?

- A: This is your decision. The small animals are in the hall so they will have shelter.
- Q: Where do the lambs, calves, dogs, ponies and other outdoor animals go?
- A: On the Sports Field near the Turf (calves), Along the fenceline at the Oakwood entrance (Lambs this is a change back to this place from last year where we were in the back paddock), bikeshed area (for the non-competitive dogs), near caretakers shed (for competitive dogs). Children bringing pets will be shown where to go prior to the day by Mr Poulgrain.
- Q: Do all the pets have to be registered on the day?
- A: Only the lambs and calves. Owners need to check in to their area to get a number tag.

## Q: Is there food and drink available? -

A: Yes there is. The PTA will be catering on the day, and Eftpos will be available.

## Q: What do the tamariki do after lunch?

A: The tamariki from various classroms run games and stalls. Children are encouraged to bring some pocket money so they can take part.

## Q: What is the process if I would like to take my child home early on the day?

*A:* We would ask tamariki to be at school until at least 1:30pm. A parent or caregiver will need to sign them out through the *Sign Out sheet in their classroom.* 

# NB: If your child is going to be absent on Friday, please let their teacher/Office know ASAP.

## **BRACE YOURSELF!** ROUNDABOUT WORK SET TO START AT MANGOREI INTERSECTION Roundabout construction at the intersection of SH3 and Mangorei Road will commence from <u>Monday 4</u> <u>November</u>

- Work is scheduled to take **15-18 months** to complete, weather permitting.
- Work will be completed mostly during the day, Monday to Friday, under contraflow traffic controls with a reduced speed limit. This means that both lanes of traffic will continue to use SH3 with minimal delays.
- Access to and from Mangorei Road at SH3 will not be impacted. Access to property in the area, including both residences and businesses, will be maintained at all times.
- Where possible, crews will also complete some of the work at night under stop/go traffic controls with minimal delays.

Please note that these works are separate to the maintenance currently underway at SH3 Burgess Park between Hydro and Allan Roads. This work is part of the SH3 New Plymouth to Hāwera Safety Improvements Project, which has improved safety at a number of areas in this corridor and installed almost 7.5km of flexible median barriers and wide centrelines.
