## **PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE**

Ngā mihi o te rā Whanau o Mangorei,

What a beaut few days. Nothing like some Vitamin D production after some sunshine, although tempered by a sunhat and shade as well, as we head closer to summer!

The summer break is on the horizon and lots of opportunities for us to connect as home and school with our School Performance Afternoon, Parent Helpers Morning Tea, School Book Fair in the library, Whole School Fancy Dress at the TSB Stadium, and of course our Year 8 assembly for our Year 8 caregivers and family. Chances to help out are seen in our River Safety sessions for our Y7/8 classes, Science Roadshow for Y4-8's and the various celebration activities for the end of year! If you can we would love to see you at some (or all!) of these.

One thing on top at the moment are the preparations for the upgrade of the Senior Bathrooms. A long time coming, the board have been working on this since last year to make this space better for our tamariki. The space will become more inclusive for students with disabilities, and will have separate unisex bathrooms. This is to futureproof the space for all students to be able to use. The design maximises the space available and will be a welcome upgrade from the 1970's construction that has done us so well for so many years.

Work on this is set to start before the end of the school year and so we will be putting in place a plan for where our seniors will be able to go. We have been lucky to have three new bathrooms in place in our new block, as well as the hall bathrooms to help with this over the last few weeks of school. Special thanks to **Daryl Austin** helping getting the wheels in motion earlier in the year, and now current board member **Peter George** who is in support.

We very much appreciate the community keeping their tamariki at home this Friday. We are holding our second of two Ministry provided Teacher Only Days and will have Ministry Curriculum Lead **Brigitte Luke** at school to take us through the brand new Mathematics and Statistics Curriculum. As a teaching staff we had already gone through the draft curriculum and provided feedback on it, so it has been interesting to see what impact this has had to the 'final' copy.

As part of supporting the Mathematics Curriculum structured direction, schools have been offered to select out of four reputable (some research based, some evidence based) maths programmes that the Government will provide free to schools in 2025. We expected to see PR1ME as one of the supporting programmes which we have used since 2016 and this was the case. This means that our staff are already very familiar with the scope and sequence of this programme and the massive bonus from a budget point of view is we won't have to pay for the workbooks and teacher manuals in 2025! There were two other programmes we looked at which did get our curiosity up and so we will monitor what other schools find from using these resources and what data they find in learning, progress and achievement. We are always looking to know better because when we know better we can do better!

## YEAR 7/8 RIVER SAFETY

Every second year the Te Tai o Rehua Syndicate make their way down to TSB Topec to participate in a River Safety day. The **River Safety Programme** consists of a combination of theory and practical elements, most of which take place in or around a well-maintained, and water-level controlled water-race located onsite. The programme is offered as a full school day activity, starting with some discussion and videos in class, before heading out to apply learning on the water. All activities are run by TOPEC staff. Wetsuits, life jackets and helmets are supplied by TOPEC, unless you have your own you would like to use.

We will be asking for parent helpers for the days and a link to a medical form and gear list will be sent home next week. Please let your child's classroom teacher know if you are able to assist with transport and supervision on the day.

## YEAR 7/8 CAMP 2025

We are beginning preparations for our Year 7 and 8 camp at Forest Lakes in Otaki for next year. The week-long camp is from **Monday 17<sup>th</sup> March 2025 - Friday 21<sup>st</sup> March 2025**. It is a busy but very rewarding week and we ask that you have a good level of fitness, a willingness to get involved and a good sense of humour. #### SH3 IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT: MANGOREI ROAD ROUNDABOUT NOW UNDERWAY

Work has now commenced to install a roundabout at the intersection of SH3 and Mangorei Road south of New Plymouth. Here is what you need to know:

- Work is scheduled to take 15-18 months to complete, weather permitting.
- In addition to roundabout construction, the ~2.5km long site includes removal of the northbound passing lane, road widening for a wide centreline, retaining walls, laying of structural asphalt, drainage, kerb and channel works as well as crossing islands and footpath improvements.
- Work will be completed mostly during the day, Monday to Friday, under contraflow traffic controls with a reduced speed limit. This means that both lanes of traffic will continue to use SH3 with minimal delays.
- Access to and from Mangorei Road at SH3 will not be impacted. Access to property in the area, including both residences and businesses, will be maintained at all times.
- Where possible, crews will also complete some of the work at night under stop/go traffic controls with minimal delays.

This work is part of the SH3 New Plymouth to Hāwera Safety Improvements Project, which has improved safety at a number of areas in this corridor and installed nearly 10km of flexible median barriers and wide centrelines to date.
