PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Tena Koutou o ngā whānau o Mangorei,

Nau Mai, Haere Mai, Hoki mai! Welcome to our returning and new families to Mangorei School. We are very excited to be getting back underway and having the privilege of helping your tamariki on their all important learning journey for 2025.

I know the start of the year has been a bit unorthodox with our later start (we did start early for the first time last year) combined with the positioning of Waitangi Day. As a school we are to be open for 386 half days and so we are meeting this, meaning we finish later than most schools (as we saw last year). Feedback from the previous year was that parents appreciated having students at school longer during the December month in the lead up to Christmas. We are also expected, where possible, to tie in with our local schools and one of our main High Schools are closed this Friday, as well as some other primary schools in our area. We could see that our school attendance on Friday was going to be poor with a large amount of parents taking the one day as annual leave to holiday (to get a four day weekend to spend with family), as well as whānau returning from Chinese New Year celebrations, and so to maximise attendance we decided to add this day to the end of the year as opposed to being open this Friday.

We also are directed to have two Curriculum Refresh days this year. We will have one of these in Week 6 of Term 3, and the other we will do at the very end of the year when school has closed so these will only impact on our community with one day in the year. I'd also like to note that our staff had been called back in their holiday break for professional development on the curriculum refresh as well. As a parent though I know that having a later start can feel like a waiting game but I do want to reassure you that we are still doing the amount of days we are directed to do in 2025! We finish on Wednesday 17th December by the time we account for the curriculum days.

There are many times for you to be involved in the school and your child's learning so please take the time to gander through the newsletter in order to take up these opportunities.

In terms of our school we are nearing the end of the Senior Bathroom redevelopment and will be excited to have new, modern facilities for our Year 7 and 8 students. With this just being a refurbishment we won't be doing an official opening as such but this does not reduce the huge effort behind the scene of the Mangorei School Board in pushing for this facility to be pulled into the modern era!

A special thanks to *Andy* and *Bernie* our Caretaker duo, along with *Andrea Mathews, Hayley Olliver, Stephanie Taylor, Tim Suckling* & *Brendon Gatley* who have assisted with the pool over the summer. We certainly could not have had this open for our keyholder families without the help provided. Also thank you to grandmother *Karen Gwerder* who continues to volunteer time to come and help with our gardens as well.

I look forward to connecting up with you all over the upcoming term. Ngā Mihi,

SCHOOL PICNIC/MEET THE TEACHER EVENING/CAMP INFORMATION MEETING

Get it in your calendar!! **Thursday 20th February - School Picnic/Meet the Teacher Evening.** The school grounds will be the host to a school picnic that starts from 5.30pm onwards where you can bring a blanket and some kai to have with your family. There will be sports gear out and the school pool will be open for use during the time. It is a lovely way to connect with other families, maybe introduce yourself to some new faces and enjoy some time together.

During the afternoon the teachers will head to their classes at set times where they will do a mini-presentation on how the class operates, explanations on how things are taught and what routines exist in the class. It is an opportunity to ask class related questions (anything around school processes see Gary who will also be around) and get familiar with the place your child will be visiting 200 times over the year. YEAR 7/8 IMMUNISATIONS

On Monday 3rd March we have our Public Health Team coming in to administer vaccinations to our Year 7/8 Students. Please return these to school promptly. No immunisations can be given without the signed consent form being returned to school. You can opt to take your child to your GP for these immunisations if you prefer.

Please ensure your child has their wide brimmed hat each day at school for Terms 1 & 4. Students who do not have their hats will be directed to a shaded area at the front of the school during break times.

TECHNOLOGY AT DEVON

We have our first session of Technology at Devon Intermediate next Wednesday for our Year 7 and 8 students who travel down by bus with our Teacher Aides and rotate around five different Technology classes over the year. The bus leaves Mangorei School just after 8.30am so it is important that all Year 7 and 8 students are at school by 8.30am on Wednesday's. If you are going to be dropping your child off at Devon Intermediate for any reason please let the school office know. Fees for these classes are set by Devon Intermediate and will be added to your child's account through the office once we are advised.

ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE TIMES ONSITE FOR STUDENTS

We have our bus students who arrive a little earlier than that and stay in the grounds. Children who are not on the bus, or part of the YMCA After School Care are expected to **vacate the school grounds by 3.15pm**. BEING SAFE AT 3PM

As a reminder, at 3pm when the bell goes can we please ask our community to do some important actions to ensure the safety of our tamariki and other footpath and road users.

- 1. Use the Kea Crossing when it is operational between 3pm and 3.10pm if needing to cross the road. Our tamariki are impressionable and so if you cross over on the Tūpare bend or at other places on the busy Mangorei Road it is sending messages to them about taking these chances themselves.
- 2. Do not park on the yellow lines/or double park in the school driveway/ or the neighbours driveways or attempt to squeeze past cones in the bus bay. Please be considerate of the visibility that our patrollers need to see up and down Mangorei Road. We have seen cars being ticketed in the past for some of these driving behaviours.
- **3.** Speed limits are important at this time. <u>You must</u> be doing 30 km per hour past the school when you leave at this time.
