PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Kia Ora Mangorei Whānau,

It is great to be back in the routine of school and to see the exciting learning going on in classes from the get go! Teachers have been prioritising the development of a positive, friendly, learning-focused environment and have all been commenting about how ready for learning the tamariki are, so well done whānau!

Next week there are three opportunities for us to connect up and so I do encourage you to make the most of these opportunities to do so. On **Monday 15th February**, our New Entrants up to Year 6's are inviting parents to come in during their swimming session to see some of the learning they are doing in the pool around water safety. Teachers will communicate when their sessions are via HERO. On **Wednesday 19th February** in the afternoon at **2pm** we are holding our Traditional Mangorei Mihi Whakatau Welcome, to our new families here at school. We would love to see our new parents for this which, if the weather is fine, will involve the whole school on the front court. We have some shared kai afterwards with it finishing close to the 3pm near the end of day. Existing families are welcome to come and be part of the school as the welcomers. Thirdly, on **Thursday 20th February** we have the School Picnic and Meet the Teacher evening starting at 5.30pm. Bring some kai and a blanket and come and join us on the school field. Depending on what Roopu (syndicate) your child is in, there will be a time to go to the class to hear the teacher talk about the unique nature of the class and how the programme runs. At the end of the class sessions there is an important **Camp meeting for all Year 7/8 parents** to attend. More details further in the newsletter. We would dearly love to see you connect with us as we partner up for the year!

Talking of 'partnering up', on behalf of the staff, I very much want to encourage you to consider how you may be able to support your child's' school. PERIOD PRODUCTS IN SCHOOLS

The Ministry of Education is providing period products (pads) to students to allow them to manage their monthly cycle. SCHOOL PICNIC/MEET THE TEACHER EVENING/CAMP INFORMATION MEETING

Get it in your calendar! **Thursday 20th February - School Picnic/Meet the Teacher Evening.** The school grounds will be the host to a school picnic that starts from 5.30pm onwards where you can bring a blanket and some kai to have with your family. There will be sports gear out and the school pool will be open for use during the time. It is a lovely way to connect with other families, maybe introduce yourself to some new faces and enjoy some time together. During the afternoon the teachers will head to their classes at set times where they will do a mini-presentation on how the class operates, explanations on how things are taught and what routines exist in the class. It is an opportunity to ask class related questions (anything around school processes see Gary who will also be around) and get familiar with the place your child will be visiting 200 times over the year. This will cover all you need to know in preparation for our camp coming up in March. If you have questions that are more personal to your child then please do not hesitate to make a separate appointment time with your child's teacher on another day.
