I hope you were able to engage with the class teacher and hear about the class programme, what happens in the day to day and what they are currently up to in learning in literacy and maths. #### MANGOREI SCHOOL DIGITAL USER AGREEMENT OVERVIEW

Digital technologies are tools that can help us learn at school in all sorts of ways. Some of these ways include looking at interesting things online, talking to people, creating music and media, gathering new ideas, and learning how to use tools.

When we use digital technologies and online spaces it's important that we learn ways to keep ourselves safe, and that we make positive choices in ways we behave when we are online.

At Mangorei School we call this being a 'digital citizen' and good digital citizens help to make our school a safe and positive place for everyone.

This agreement shares what Mangorei School does to help make learning online safe, and what ākonga need to do.

We know it is not always easy to understand everything about online spaces. It can be complicated at times, and sometimes things can go wrong. This is why it's important that we commit to making it as safe as possible to use digital tools and online spaces for learning.

This agreement covers situations where ākonga are using Digital Technologies for school purposes be it on or offsite.

#### MANGOREI SCHOOL'S ROLE

Kaiako will do this by:

- teaching about positive online behaviours and ways to keep safe through the Mangorei Digital RATE Agreement
- overseeing the use of the school's digital devices and online spaces by ākonga
- helping ākonga who need support to use UNPIC to solve problems
- · keeping personal information the school collects about äkonga safe
- implementing the Technologies Curriculum
- · actively monitoring students' accounts to ensure digital citizenship and safety when needed

Tumuaki / Mangorei School Board will do this by:

- · ensuring we have the appropriate security and resources to protect everybody
- · keeping personal information the school collects about äkonga safe
- · being aware of the roles kaiako have
- · providing professional development for all staff to advance learning
- · helping kaiako who need support to deal with online problems for tamariki
- · reviewing appropriate policies on School Docs regularly and communicating these with the community

## **REQUIRED PAYMENTS**

Required payments are for all goods or services that your child has received during the year, such as any stationery that they have purchased through the office, trips and activities, technology fees, camp fees, sports team registration fees, kapa haka performances, excursions etc and are required to be paid much like you would pay a telephone or power bill.

## **REQUESTED PAYMENTS**

Requested payments are Donation payments that the Board of Trustees asks families to pay as a donation for each child attending here at Mangorei School. Unlike a lot of other schools where they are eligible for a donations scheme (i.e The Government pay the donation), we, as a low equity school, are not. We request that families pay the annual amount of \$150. Donations help us to cover things like maintaining playgrounds and the school swimming pool and in some instances to subsidise costs of trips and events which help keeps costs minimal so that we can continue to provide quality and a variety experiences to our tamariki.

## WHERE WILL I SEE MY ACCOUNT

You can see accounts on the **HERO** app. Statements are periodically updated and issued via email from the school office.

## WAYS TO MAKE PAYMENTS

Our preferred payment method is online banking. Please include your child's first and surname and the invoice number as a reference. We welcome part payments and installments. Many parents find it is easier to chip away at school fees across the year.
