2025 Miniball and Basketball Registration Form

KEY INFORMATION

- The season goes from Mid-May to September.
- Year 0-2 and Year 3-4 teams play Miniball, mostly between 3.30pm and 5.45pm on a Wednesday, but with the odd game on a Monday for Year 0-2 or Tuesday for Year 3-4 afterschool.
- Year 5/6 teams play between 4pm and 6.40pm on a Monday.
- Year 7/8 boys teams play Monday evenings.
- Year 7/8 girls teams play on Tuesday afternoons.
- Students will be issued with a Mangorei uniform to play in.
- Practice times will be advised once coaches are aligned with teams.
- As with last year, mouthguards are compulsory for all levels (one is provided at start of season by the NPBA).

Completing the entry is a commitment to play a team sport. Teams are organised based on these numbers (along with the subs) and withdrawal can greatly affect others in the team. If you have more than one child playing please complete separate forms for each. Can't wait to see our kids on the court!

YEARS 3-8 WINTER HOCKEY REGISTRATIONS

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, registrations for your child to play Hockey at Mangorei in 2025 are now open.

To register, go to Year 3-8 Winter Hockey Registration Form and complete the registration form by FRIDAY 21STMARCH

DETAILS ARE AS FOLLOWS;

MINI STICKS (YEAR 3-4): Games are played on Saturdays starting on: Saturday 3rd May until Saturday 13th September. (6-a-side, quarter turf games) Subs are \$70 for the season.

KIWI STICKS (YEAR 5-6): Games are played on Saturdays starting on: Saturday 3rd May *until* Saturday 13th September. (7-a-side, half turf games) Subs are \$85 for the season.

KWIK STICKS (YEAR 7-8): Games are played on Monday or Friday nights starting on: Friday 28th April *until* Monday 18th August. (7-a-side, half turf games.) Subs are \$110 for the season.

All games are played at *Webster Field, New Plymouth*. Subs for the season cover player entry fees, as well as use and replenishment of team gear.

*Please note that registering your child is a commitment to the team, players must attend practices and each game, unless a valid reason is given. Fees are non-refundable *
