The school has been a quieter place without 77 of our young people. On Monday, the Year 7 and 8 students got on their coaches to head to Ōtaki and with the last check in were having a blast. Lots of high ropes and aquatics fun was being had, in amongst heavy rain and sunshine!. We look forward to their safe return and want to acknowledge the work of the Te Tai o Rēhua Syndicate lead by *Emma Saywell*, and the wonderful parents who are making this experience happen for our kids. It has been a while but through applying for grants and donations over the years from our PTA we have finally been able to meet the cost of new shade sails over the playground outside Kererū and Kāhu. We take being sun smart seriously with our no hat, no play policy, sunblock stations around the school and cleaning and maintaining the sails over the Junior Playground. Having new shade sails installed in time for Term 4 this year will be a really great way to increase the shade around the school for our kids. Thank you to the past generations of families who bought sausages, did baking, set up a gazebo or two, or got an Easter raffle ticket over the years - the PTA contribution has been crucial in getting it across the line!

I know some of those parents in the community who also came to Mangorei as kids will remember our dental clinic (or murder house? As I have heard mentioned!). This was rescued from demolition over 10 years ago when dental services were combined down by Girls' High School. We had known it as the 'Cottage' but it has recently been renamed to fit in line with our school narrative to become 'Whio'. The Whio is the only NZ Duck that lives in fast flowing rivers and was practically extinct after the ravages of Stoats and Weasels on the Maunga. Now they are thriving and can be found in our awa - the Waiwhakaiho. This is no longer a teeth pulling location, but is a breakout room for staff to use, as well as a back office for our Structured Literacy Approach teacher *Janet King* to take students for extra support in literacy.

I hope you have a wonderful rest of your week - I am off to camp this arvo so will be able to see first hand the great efforts of the kids!
