### **PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE:**

I know the newsletter is a bit of a novel at times. We are going to invite our families early next term to let us know how you best feel informed about the many goings-on at Mangorei School. We have made efforts to communicate in a variety of mediums over time and are more than aware that our families situations have changed over time also. We want to be hitting the mark when it comes to clear, concise information sharing. Look out for this survey early Term 2.

By the end of this week all students will have a settling statement posted on HERO. This post talks about how your child has gone about getting into their learning for the year. By the end of the term you will also see Term 1 Literacy and Mathematics Posts giving a snapshot of what has been happening in these curriculum areas. These are part of a picture of how school is going for your child. The other parts are the conversations you have with your child, what you see when you pop into class eg. Whānau Kai Tahi days as well as the communication you have with the teacher. We have scheduled our Mid Year Interviews for the very start of Term 3, but please remember that if you have any questions on your child's learning then you don't wait for these times!

You will see later in the newsletter we are having a trial run of offering a Weet-bix breakfast at school on Mondays and Tuesdays next week. Over the years our Country bus kids have had their bus times get earlier and earlier and we are seeing an increase in tamariki having to get into their lunchboxes on arrival to school. The trial is not just for our bus whānau though - everyone is welcome. We know that kids struggle to learn if hungry and so we do this in an indirect way to help our kids be better prepared to learn. We will measure and see if we have this need - if so, we would then love some of our community to come on board and support this kaupapa. Big thanks to our teachers who are doing this for our kids, and also to our families last year who donated bowls and spoons for this to happen.

Other teachers to thank are *Mrs Anne Stuck* and *Mrs Kate Gwerder* for being good sports and getting slimed at school in support of the School Colour Run! 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### FUN ANZAC ACTIVITY - CREATING A POPPY WALL IN THE LIBRARY

Our library is a special place, and this year, as a lead up to ANZAC Day, I would like to create a Poppy Wall in the library for everyone to see. Traditionally our ANZAC Day is about those "who served and died in all wars, conflicts, and peacekeeping operations" and "the contribution and suffering of all those who have



served", predominantly across New Zealand, Australia, Tonga, and some of the South Pacific Islands. However, I thought this could be a special way to encompass all of our students, as we have such wonderful diversity here at Mangorei School, and family histories that extend around the world. The poppies will allow us to have a visual representation to show just how many of us have family who have served and sacrificed, or are still serving for our country (or their home country).

Poppy templates will be distributed through classrooms for students to colour, but I would like to go a step further, and where possible add both the student's name and the name of a family member (past or present), that is linked to the students, so we can recognise their contribution in times of war and peace. (A little like the crosses we install outside, but a little less formal). This could include parents, grandparents, uncles, aunts, sisters and brothers, extended family, or anyone who has significant meaning to your family. It would be great to include the division/unit they were in, where they fought, and any other note if wished.

An example would be:

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#### **STUDENT:** Sam Gwerder

FAMILY MEMBER/MEMBERS: Great-Uncle Peter Bates, military, fought in Egypt, captured P.O.W

I would greatly appreciate it if you are able to email this information to me (along with the student's name so I can link it to the correct poppy). Students are welcome to do more than one poppy if they have a number of family members they want to recognise. If I can have information sent through to me by Wednesday April 2<sup>nd</sup> that would be greatly appreciated.

Please note that this isn't a compulsory activity, and there is no pressure for students to participate as we know such things around war can in some cases be very personal, however we would welcome anybody who would like to contribute.

## NIGHT WORKS - SH3 NEW PLYMOUTH TO HĀWERA SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT, MANGOREI ROAD ROUNDABOUT: 30 MARCH-17 APRIL

Work to install a roundabout at the intersection of SH3 and Mangorei Road, south of New Plymouth continues, with much of the initial enabling works complete. Crews will soon commence the pavement reconstruction at this intersection. This work involves removing existing road material and replacing it with aggregate and asphalt, to improve the safety and resilience of this busy road.

To complete this work as safely and efficiently as possible, this work will be completed at night (7pm-6am, Sunday-Thursday) under stop/go traffic controls, with access to/from Mangorei Road at SH3 closed during works.

Here is what you need to know:

- Work is scheduled on Sunday 30 March and is expected to take approximately 3 weeks to complete, weather permitting.
- Work will take place Sunday-Thursday each week between 7pm and 6am, weather permitting.
- During the above working hours, the site will be run under stop/go traffic controls on SH3, and access to and from Mangorei Road on both sides of the intersection will be closed.
- During this time, alternative routes for Mangorei Road will be available via Carrington and Baker Roads, as well as via Cumberland Street.
- During the day (6am-7pm), and on Friday and Saturday nights, SH3 will return to contraflow (two-way) traffic controls, with access to/from Mangorei Road open.
