## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE:

Kia Ora Team Mangorei!

There is a lovely refreshed look to the tamariki coming in through the front gate and lots of great stories of holidays had and fun experienced. I hope that as parents you had some down time yourselves over the Easter Break and are ready to roll into an action packed and exciting Term 2.

We start the term, by putting back in front of our tamariki the importance of ANZAC Day to our national identity. This week we hold our special ANZAC Day assembly on **Friday at 10am** and have **Colonel Brendon Jull** attending to address the assembly. Late last year, Brendon was appointed as the Assistant Chief of Army (Reserves), the top reserve appointment in the country, reporting to the Chief of Army. We also have Brass Band Cornet Player - **Bryce Gordon** - coming to play the last post. The assembly is coordinated by our School Ambassadors and all are welcome. Weather permitting it will be outside by the School Flagpole.

These hui are planned for **Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> May at 11am and then again at 3.15pm**. We would love to have connection and contribution of ideas from past generations of Mangorei Old Boys and Girls. If you have a connection to anyone in this group, please feel free to pass this invitation on. We would love to have them represented at these huis.

These first three weeks are a real collection of great reasons to be a student at Mangorei! Te Tihi o Taranaki are visiting the local Art Gallery and studying fire safety - including a firefighter visit. We have sports exchanges for our Year 5 and 6 tamariki including trips away to play, we will host a school here, as well as Tackle 5 sessions. # CONSULTATION ON NEW RELATIONSHIPS AND SEXUALITY EDUCATION FRAMEWORK

The government have released a new draft framework on how schools are to teach two areas of the Health Curriculum - 'Sexuality Education' and 'Body Care and Physical Safety'. The consultation period is very short - it opened in the holidays, through to 9<sup>th</sup> May 2025. Schools and their communities are welcome to have a say on the proposed framework. This consultation is clear in it's messaging that this framework will not be implemented until 2027, that as a school we will do our own consultation with our whānau before implementing it here and that parents have the right to withdraw their children from sessions. e.g. If it differs from the family's religious or cultural values. There is still a long way to go before implementation in 2027 so expect updates over the next few years.

# **2025 KIWI ENGLISH, MATHEMATICS & SCIENCE COMPETITIONS**

Mangorei School is offering your child the opportunity to participate in the KIWI English, Mathematics and Science competitions. These competitions take place annually and are designed by New Zealand teachers for New Zealand students based on the New Zealand Curriculum. These are replacing the ICAS exams that have traditionally been done at school. The competitions are open to all Year 5-8 students in English, Mathematics and Science. Students can enter in one or more subjects. Each competition will provide parents/caregivers with an individual student report of their child's overall performance. These are available through your school. The supervised online tests will take place in the last 3 weeks of Term 2 and the first week of Term 3. The competitions are to be administered at school under exam conditions and supervised. All participating students will receive a certificate and a prize will be awarded to the top student nationally in each competition. If two or more students share the same top score then the prize is awarded to the student with the highest speed and accuracy.

**NOTE:** Their policy is not to release test papers. The tests are provided primarily as a competition and not as a teaching resource. Entries are administered by the school. For further information, please consult the CAM website: www.canterbury.ac.nz/cam

There are a number of ways to let us know of an absence:

- **HERO APP:** Open the <u>**HERO**</u> app, click Report an Absence, select the Reason for the Absence and then a short explanation for the absence, eg, sore throat, sore tummy, doctors' appointment etc. You will then get a notification that school has been notified.
- **TEXT:** The school cell phone on 027 758 7860 with your child's name and the reason for their absence.
- EMAIL: <u>office@mangorei.school.nz</u> with your child's name and the reason for their absence.
- PHONE: Phone the school office on (06) 758 7860

If we have not received notification of an absence, please expect a text message or call from school asking you to confirm that your child is away. If text messages are unanswered, someone will phone to follow up. This helps us to ensure that all tamariki are accounted for and safe.
