The end of last term came and went and I wanted to acknowledge the efforts of our Term I and 2 Ambassadors **Caleb O'Mara** and **Jeannie Lee**, supported by deputies **Ilse Janse van Rensburg** and **Carlo Branca**. They lead a fabulous group of future leaders with our school councillors to achieve some excellent outcomes for the school - please see below:

- Choosing the school values focus on safety after school using the kea crossing and how to safely enter/exit the school on bikes/scooters and using the footpath. Creating a video to show this for our kids and community.
- Running the donations for the WISE Trust in getting 6 boxes of pyjamas, as well as raising nearly \$300 to support insulation in homes and keeping kids warm at night
- Lobbying the school over improvements- classes wanted councillors to improve the state of the school changing sheds by the pool (Caretakers are investigating changes ready for summer), getting bigger football goals (these have been put in over the holidays.) Senior councillors were unhappy with the locks on the new senior bathrooms and so these have been changed to be more functional.
- The running of a fantastic wheels day over a lunchtime purely for fun!

Well done team! I look forward to seeing what the Term 3 and 4 student leadership team can achieve!
