



BREAKFAST IN SCHOOLS - PARAKUIHI

In Term 3 we are keen to re-start offering Parakuihi/Breakfast again at our kura. From our trials earlier in the year having a breakfast option is really valuable to our bus tamariki, and other children who have been up for a while and need a bit of kai top up. Also children who have been a bit rushed in the morning and might not have felt like food at home. Just as importantly, it is a really valuable social time, and a chance to give children an environment of food curiosity to try things they may not normally taste.

We have a few interested parents keen to be part of this group so far, but would love to have more volunteers for our team. Ideally we would like to have a roster going as often through a week as we can, but even getting it up and running 2 or 3 times in a week would be a great start. This is similar to how some other New Plymouth schools run their breakfast clubs.

The role would include helping to serve weetbix and milk, sometimes other food too, and supporting the children to wash up. It would also involve helping to leave the kitchen tidy. We would ideally have some senior students helping as part of Service and Duties to school as well. Depending on numbers coming through we have the Ahuwhenua kitchen or the hall as places we can use.

If you are able to help out regularly any day between 8:10am and 9am we would love to have your help. If you are able to help out occasionally depending on your schedule we would also love to hear from you! Having a couple of parents on a roster at a time would be super.

We would also like to gather a few extra tools and implements to enable us to offer some different kinds of breakfast options. If anyone has a 4 slice toaster or an electric fry pan that they would be able to donate to help us offer other food options from time to time these would be appreciated. At anytime if you are clearing out dessert spoons, butter knives, bowls or plates we would also appreciate donations of these items.
