PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Kia Ora Mangorei Whānau!

Another week in and another week to celebrate the great learning our students have been doing! We continue our tradition of having a very strong contingent of our Year 7 and 8 students being recognised with prizes at the Taranaki Science and Technology Fair. Twenty-two of our students have been recognised with placings, special awards or merits for their Scientific Investigations or other entries, with some of these receiving more than one award - ka rawe kia koutou! You are all awesome! We will put in next week's newsletter what these awards are for. Well done to the teachers and students for their mahi (work and effort). The way our kaiako (teachers) get in quite deep with the kids about the scientific process sees them well set up for High School and it is lovely these are recognised by external judges.

I have seen some kids huffing and puffing around the field lately, which is the usual signal for the Endurance and Resilience Run and Obstacle Course event which is coming up on **Friday 15th August.** We will have the 'run'sheet (see what I did there) out soon so you can make the time to come and watch you child take part. You should definitely keep the lunchtime free as this gives you the opportunity to go with your child into their class to see what they have been up to with their learning - a kind of personalised tour that your child can do for you! The PTA are giving pizza a go this time around, instead of the usual sausage sizzle so watch for some changes as we get closer to the day!

It has been wonderful to see the Parakuihi Breakfast sessions restart again over the winter term and special thanks to those parents that have helped to kickstart it again with the organisation by *Mrs van Greevenbroek* and her team. We all know that learning on an empty tummy can be challenging and that we do have some kids who on arrival to school eat all the contents of their lunchbox before the bell even rings! Some tamariki (children) on our farms are up super early while milking or calving is underway and so a top up of breakfast can also be what's needed. We also have some that are up before 6am for training in their chosen sports, such as swimming and so some kai (food) can help them 'dive' into their learning. There is absolutely no stigma in having breakfast and we are promoting it so - parents, you are also welcome to come in with your child if you'd like. At present we are doing Mondays and Thursdays in the Ahuwhenua kitchen which is between Korimako and Kōtare (closest classes to the hall). The more volunteers, the more days we can offer this. Have an enjoyable rest of your week and congratulations to our Science Fair Winners who will be receiving awards tonight at the Taranaki Science and Technology prize giving - mīharo! Excellent!

MANGOREI SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS 2025

The boards of all state and state integrated schools are required to hold elections every three years, and this will be happening again in 2025.

The School Board plays a vital role in the governance of our school. It is responsible for setting the strategic direction, consulting with our school community, ensuring the effective use of school funding, and upholding the principles of Te Tiriti o Waitangi within our school environment.

Our board is comprised of five elected parent representatives, the Tumuaki (Principal), and one staff representative elected by school staff.

- Bring a warm layer and a rain jacket we'll be outside for most of the day


SLANZA SCHOOL LIBRARY WEEK
