#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Kia ora koutou whānau - welcome to the penultimate week of the term!

It is a week where we start to enter into the unknown around the latest negotiations between various education unions and the government. The union for primary teachers have had a second offer which looks to still lack detail at addressing some of the conditions being sought after. One of the key requests was for more support staff to help students with learning or behavioural needs in each class. Imagine having a trained teacher aide to assist a teacher in every class? This would certainly help raise student achievement in classes, especially for our tamariki that would benefit with more 1:1 time and assistance.

At present there are over 25,000 signatures on a petition to urge the government to provide greater support to schools. I know that pay has dominated the media waves but this is only related to one of the big concerns teachers have - attracting and retaining more teachers to the profession. You will know I have spoken about the challenges we (and many schools in Taranaki, and indeed in NZ) face with relieving teachers. Just last week we were faced with no available teachers after our list was exhausted - most already working, and some now no longer available as they have been pulled into longer term positions due to shortages. There are teachers going to Australia due to the significant amount more they can earn there.

As we look to come to the end of Term 3 we start to set out sights on one of our key important days for the school - **Pets Day**. For this reason please have a good talk with your child about what it means to bring a pet along. Every pet will receive the special 2025 Pets Day ribbon - a special keepsake, and of course the special memory of sharing their pet at school. We are aiming for great participation this year as we build towards our special 100th next year! All Pets are welcome - we have great provision for indoor animals - chickens, cats, guinea pigs, goldfish, mice, turtles are some examples. We can also accommodate outside bigger animals such as ponies or goats. Dogs can be entered into an obstacle course competition (competitive- with placing ribbons and junior and senior champions) or to be just viewed by a judge for their rearing (non-competitive). The key competition of the day are our lambs and calves though - judged for leading and rearing as we look to find champion calf and lamb to win our trophies for the day!

#### WHAT IS THIS NAME TO! TO! WHAKAMANAWA YOU ASK?

After being named 'Mangorei School Kapa Haka Group' for many years Shane Cassidy, our Tūparekino Iwi consultant gifted us the name back in August 2023.

The words 'toi toi' are representative of the dance done by the Pīwakawaka. Pīwakawaka are known for flitting about, clearing a pathway (te ara pai), and interweaving experiences.

The word 'whakamanawa' means to encourage, to inspire, to instill and provide a platform for Māoridom and Māori Tikanga.

Our kura are so proud to be represented by our Toitoiwhakamanawa. Ka rawe to mahi ki a koutou!

- → Be considerate when outside the ring for other competitors.
- Remember you are being judged right up until you exit the ring.
- → Give your dog a pat when you are finished.



#### **LEADING**


- → Know the course.

- → Be considerate when outside the ring for other competitors.
- → Remember you are being judged right up until you exit the ring.
- → Give your calf a pat when you are finished (some judges watch for this).
- → Make sure your calf is beside your right hand at all times.



#### WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR LAMB

#### **LEADING**

- → Know the course.
- → Talk to your lamb.
- → Relax, smile, enjoy.
- → Walk 'together' with your lamb at a 'relaxed' pace.
- → Be considerate when outside the ring for other competitors.
- → Remember you are being judged right up until you exit the ring.
- → Give your lamb a pat when you are finished (some judges watch for this).
   → Make sure your lamb is beside your right hand at all times.
- → There will be an optional Lamb Guzzle. The amount of milk is 250ml.
