PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Kia ora koutou whānau!

It has been all go this morning here with TOPEC arriving with a trailer load of native seedlings to be potted and a keen team of Y5-8's helping out. Once again we feel very blessed to have the natural beauty of TOPEC just down the road and they were so grateful to have the support of our tamariki to pot over 300 plants to continue the restoration of the native bush near our school. Big thanks to Mr Craig Henson for sorting it out and I know he will be keen to share more about this, and our recent senior trips there in next week's newsletter.

There is general excitement building around the school with Pets Day next week but of course the lead up to the day is anything but orthodox with the school closed for instruction on Thursday 23rd October (the day before)!
