PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Kia Ora Mangorei Whānau,

Swab testing has taken place in the isolated breakout space I mentioned in communication through HERO yesterday where the coloured sand product was found to have tested positive for asbestos. We are awaiting the results either today or tomorrow and this will determine the reopening and use of this space, or the process involved in a clean up that can only be done by an asbestos licensed removal company - it has been quite a journey for us all and a real shock that there are some gaps in standards allowed to sell such products. A big thank you to the staff and students who have been inconvenienced with the juggling of other locations for learning in the school - I acknowledge the natural emotions involved in such a situation and have appreciated everyone's patience as we stick to the process of making this space safe again.

On a more positive note our kura helped save a life this week! Back in 2019 the school had a Wacky Hair day to help raise money for the defibrillator cabinet to house a new device. Together with an anonymous donation the cabinet was bought and on the weekend just gone a member of the public came and used the device to help save a life! The person involved was able to get the medical attention they needed at hospital as a result - such a great 'heart-warming' story and great to share! It really does show the power of the school council in action.

Speaking of the school council they can confirm a few happenings at school - firstly a House Competition on creativity! The Mangorei School Wearable Arts with students can make wearable items at home and bring them to be paraded and judged at school. See more info later in the newsletter. Secondly, a School Disco to round out the year on Friday December 12th the councillors have decided to change the format to three separate 'Hour of Power' times with each Roopu (Y0-3, Y4-6 and Y7-8) having an hour each on the evening of December 12th. Wearable Arts 2025



COMMUNITY NEWS

Night Closure of Cumberland Street at Awanui Street intersection: 16-23 November

Crews will be completing maintenance repairs on Cumberland Street at the intersection of Awanui Street and Heta Road from Sunday 16 November for approximately 5-6 nights (weather permitting).

The work is to repair sections of the road before crews return later to reseal the road to waterproof and improve the surface.

To complete this work as safely and efficiently as possible, the road will be closed at night from 7pm-7am.

What you need to know:

MANGAMAHOE

- Cumberland Street at the intersection of Awanui Street and Heta Road will be closed from 7pm-7am each night from Sunday 16 November for 5-6 nights (weather permitting).
- The road will be open outside of these hours (7am-7pm) however a temporary speed limit with be in place for the safety of road users until the site is complete.
- Road users are asked to plan ahead and take alternative routes during this time.
