PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Xin chao (Greetings in Vietnamese),

I am writing this from Hoi An in North Vietnam as I support the Year 12 Social Sciences trip to South East Asia as a parent help. It was lovely to bring over some school supplies, first aid kits and lovely messages written by some of our students to bring to a school in Cambodia. The school children were from families where their income is from working at the dump, collecting the last of any recyclable materials that are amongst the trash. We saw the dump - a mountain as big as a 6 story building and as large as a town. Children die from being hit by machinery or in some cases falling in and being buried - absolutely horrific - all for raising around \$2.50 for a week's work. The school, up until recently, had been paying parents a bag of rice a week in order for them to let their children come to school, and keep them off the trash heap. The NPBHS boys presented a bag of rice (together with some lovely writing done by our tamariki) to each child. I'd like to thank the School Board for granting me leave to have this experience. It certainly makes one grateful for our life here in NZ and the opportunities our children have here.





We farewelled a lovely staff member Danxue Luo, who has been our Mandarin Language teacher supporting our intermediate Second Languages programme and our learners of other languages in the area of English. Danxue's support has been immeasurable and we will certainly miss the caring and thoughtful way she worked within the school.



With a week to go I hope you are keeping on top of the end of year busyness - it was lovely to hear the Music Performance went well last week, the Wearable Arts run by the council, the Halberg Trust mile and to see our wonderful parent helpers honoured in our morning tea. I see parents supporting our beach ed sessions this week and gearing up to get their tamariki to the next council run event - the disco on Friday - thank you.

Tomorrow teachers will be posting their end of year Overall Teacher Judgements in Reading. Writing and Mathematics, as well as their summary statements giving a general comment on your child's year. If you child is in Year 0 to Year 7 it will also include their class for 2026. As we have communicated to you over the year with us required to teach to the new refreshed curriculums it has meant that we are very much in a transition time of adapting to these changes. Especially when we have the 'new new' curriculums drop in September which have such significant changes again for us to manage. Even though this is a transition time curriculum-wise, what I can say is that the teachers commitment at Mangorei remains unchanged in terms of focussing on student progress across the curriculum. As a staff we see some excellent value for our tamariki with the curriculum changes - however the timeframe and false starts are detrimental to its implementation and our energies are only finite! We will enter into 2026 with renewed energy no doubt, but we will work our way through one more week, and a good break before getting back into it!

Finally, the School Board have issued this statement on the recent changes to the Education Act which seek to make giving effect to Te Tiriti optional for school boards.

Changes to the Education and Training Act have taken away the explicit requirement for schools to give effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi. Despite this shift, the Mangorei School Board has confirmed its commitment to Te Tiriti and has agreed to join the growing number of schools across Aotearoa reaffirming its importance. We recognise that Te Tiriti o Waitangi supports all New Zealanders to understand their rights and upholds principles of partnership and equity. It also provides a framework for navigating issues of equality, inclusion, and cultural diversity, while encouraging open communication, collaboration, partnership, and self-determination for the benefit of all students and their whanau.

As a Board, we believe that strong relationships and genuine partnership are central to a thriving school community. A change in legislation does not alter the values we stand by or the responsibility we feel to uphold them. We also want to make clear our full support for our staff. Mangorei has a proud reputation, and we're committed to backing our team so that this continues well into the future.

Embedding Te Tiriti in daily school life supports positive outcomes for every learner.

Te Tiriti o Waitangi promotes a holistic, strengths-based, culturally responsive approach to wellbeing, which we strongly believe enhances the emotional, physical, spiritual, and mental health of all our students. These values guide the way we make decisions and the environment we strive to create for our school community. Thank you for your ongoing support as we continue to move forward together.


WEARABLE ARTS COMPETITION

ATTENTION - BUS USERS


